Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Patrick Lynch, Soldier in the 11 Virginia Regiment in the service of the United States having faithfully served the full term of his enlistment, is now discharged from any further service. Given under my hand, this 2nd of December 1779

S/ James Wood, Colonel Commandant

This is to certify that Patrick Lynch enlisted for three years in the 15th Virginia Regiment the 30 of November 1776. Given under my hand this 2 of June 1783

S/ David Mason, formerly Captain 11th Virginia Regiment
