Virginia Pension Claim of Aaron Weaver VAS1140

[From pension claims in the Library of Virginia.]

Know all Men by these Presents that I Aaron Weaver, of Princess Anne County, do constitute & appoint Mr. John Cornick, one of the Representatives of the said County in the Assembly of Virginia, my lawful Attorney for me, & in my Name, but to my Use, to receive from the Auditor of public Acc'ts in Richmond a Warrant for fifty Dollars due to me, on the 1<sup>st</sup> Day of January next, being my annual Pension, allowed by an Act of Ass'y passed the 10<sup>th</sup> Day of February 1812; & also to receive for me a Warrant from the Register of the Land Office for any Land, to which I may be entitled, as a Seaman in the Navy of the State of Virg'a, during the revolutionary War. In Witness whereof I have hereto set my Hand & Seal the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of Nov'r. 1812. Aaron hisAmark Weaver Signed & Sealed in Presence of Anthony Walke, JP

## NOTES:

The 1810 federal census for Princess Anne County lists "Aaron Weaver FB" (Free Black) as head of a household of free persons of color.

The file includes annual renewals of power of attorney, the last dated 1 Nov 1817. A document in the file certifies that Weaver died "in the last week in July or the first week in August, in the year 1819."
