Virginia Pension Claim of James Powell Edmondson VAS1244 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[From Revolutionary pension records in the Library of Virginia.]

I do with the advice of the Council hereby certify that James Powell Edmonson, aged about 34 years, late a private in the 9th Virg'a. Reg't, whose pay was at the rate of £24 per annum, was disabled in the service of the United States by a wound which occasioned the loss of one of his legs, and that he is allowed the sum of Fifteen pounds yearly from the first of January 1786.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, at Richmond, this 25th of May 1789.

To the orditors of publick Counts [sic: Auditors of Public Accounts]

Ordered: That it be Certifyed to the Executive that James Powell Edmonson is an Inhabitant of this County and is the Person Entitled to a Pension on the Pension List, he having lost a Legg in the engagement at Somerset Courthouse [Battle of Millstone NJ, 20 Jan 1777], and did belong to the 9th Virginia Redgment, but Detached in the Core of Riflemen under Colo [Daniel] Morgan - Aged 34 Years A Copy Teste./ Sto. Smith CFC

I desire that the warrants or money may be delivered to Hugh Innes [Sheriff] as witness my hand this 18th of April 1789
