Virginia Bounty-Land Claim of William Worsham VAS1736 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

I Do hereby certify that Lieut William Worsham of my Regiment of Light horse was enlisted into the said Regiment of Horse in the month of August 1776 and served as a Sergeant until the 5th day of January 1778 when he was promoted to a Cornetcy of Horse and served as Cornet until the 25th March 1779 when he was promoted to Lieutenant of Horse and served as such until the 18th day of August 1779 and was then killed by the Enemy Given under my hand this 11th day of Aug't. 1784 Aug't. 24 1784 Examined & passed/ S. Hawes Comm'r. Copy J. Pendleton

Deliver to George Markham a warrant or warrants for my Lands which I am or may be entitled to as heir to Lieut. Wm. Worsham late of Colo. Theodorick Blands Regiment of Light horse. Given under my hand this 18 day of Nov'r. 1784 [signed] Peter Talbott To Any person whom it may concern done in presence of Francis Petram/ William Talbott
