## Bounty Land Warrant record of William Watkins VAS1758 Transcribed by Will Graves



[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the General Assembly of Virginia

The petition of William Watkins of the County of York, humbly represents, that he enlisted early in the war of the revolution, a private in the 2<sup>nd</sup> company of Light Dragoons, commanded by Capt. William Armistead, attached to the State Legion, then under the command

of Lt. Col. Charles Dabney; that he served through the war; that from his ignorance of the course in which it was necessary to proceed, he never had his accounts for pay due him audited and adjusted; nor has he since received compensation for arrearages of pay due him for those services, that the original pay rolls of the company were (he is informed) transmitted to the office of the war department in the lists of Washington and destroyed in the conflagration of that office in the year 1804 [sic, 1800 & again in 1814] - which circumstance repels any hope of aid in adjusting his Claims. - Bending now under the weight of years, afflicted with complicated infirmities, most of them consequences attendant on the exposures incident to active field and camp duties; the prime of his youth, devoted to the service of his Country; and now suffering for the necessities of life; he approaches your honourable bodies in the humble confidence that the War worn soldier of the revolution, will not appeal in vain; that your humanity will not suffer him longer to languish in want; or consign him to poverty, to a premature grave. Your petitioner then prays that he may be placed on the pension list, with such pecuniary allowance for his future support through the short remnant of life that may be allocated him, – you in your wisdom shall deem just, and your benevolence award him; and as in duty, and in gratitude bound, he will ever pray &c
