## Petition relating to the claim of James Berwick VAS1840 Transcribed by Will Graves

The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the Hon. the General Assembly of Virginia

The Petition of John Jameson as Assignee of James Berwick humbly sheweth
That James Barwick served as an assistant Commissary of provision Stores to the troops
under the command of General Clark [presumably George Rogers Clark] from the first Day of
July 1781 to the eighth day of December in the same year and whose pay and subsistence while
in service amounted to \$264, that James Berwick made out a Copy of his Account against the
Commonwealth of Virginia, certified by Capt. William Cherry and General Clark and sold the
same to your Petitioner, together with a claim he had against the public for his Services as a
Judge Advocate for three months and seventeen days under the command of General Clark in the
Western Department as by the papers hereunto annexed will fully appear, which has never been
ascertained & your Petitioner having never had it in his power to have the same settled humbly
prays that your Honors may take his Situation under your wise Consideration and grant him what
Relief in the premises as to your Honors may seem right and your petitioner as in duty bound
will ever pray &c
