## Bounty Land Warrant record of William True VAS1853 Transcribed by Will Graves

4/9/15

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[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From bounty land records in the Library of Virginia]

At a Court held for Spotsylvania County the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November 1820 [?]

Thomas Minor came into Court and being first sworn states that William True formally of this County enlisted under him as a soldier in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia State Regiment that he enlisted in February 1778 to serve for the term of three years from the date of his enlistment.

And at a Court held for the said County of Spotsylvania the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1820

Fielding Williams came into Court and being first duly sworn declares that he knows that John True is the only son of William True formally a soldier in the revolutionary war of the  $2^{nd}$  Virginia Regiment, that he knows the said John True well, and the Court certify that they are satisfied that he is the only son and heir [several lines of text obliterated] of the said William True

Department of War Section of bounty lands March 5<sup>th</sup> 1822

Nathaniel Cutting has the honor to return to Mr. Barbour the documents intended to support the claim of the heir of William True & to inform him, that his name is not returned on the rolls of the Virginia line with those who engaged for the term of "during the War," & continued to serve to the close of the it; therefore he is not entitled to land from the United States – but may be from the State of Virginia

Spotsylvania County October 22, 1822

I do hereby certify that they within named William True who enlisted under me in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Regiment as a Soldier in the State service did not desert from the Army but served in the same until he died. Given under my hand this day and year above written.
