Petition of Josiah Riddick VAS1900 Transcribed by Will Graves

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the Hon. Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Delegates

The petition of Josiah Riddick of the County of Nansemond humbly Sheweth that your petitioner, when the invasion against [several words too faint to discern] of this state took place in May 1779) being one of a party who was ordered out to reconnoiter and having a horse impressed into the service, which fact a certificate from [several lines of text too faint to discern any words therein] since which time your petitioner has suffered a long and grievous captivity. Your petitioner has [several words too faint to discern] having lately effected an exchange and thinking himself entitled to the value of his horse, so lost in the service of his Country, applies to your honorable body, relying on your wisdom and justice hopes you will grant his request and your petitioner shall ever pray.

Petition of Josiah Riddick December 15th, 1780 Referred to Trade December 18th, 1780 Allowed £2000 for the within Horse and Accoutrements

[In an affidavit dated December 7, 1780, George Sparling, John Miles & Nicholas Jones valued the horse, saddle, bridle, holsters and pistols taken by the enemy from Josiah Riddick as being worth 5600 pounds.]
