To the Senate & house of Delegates of the Commonwealth of Virginia in General Assembly convened

The petition of David Tyrie Sen'r. an inhabitant of the County of Cumberland respectfully represents that he was a Soldier in the Revolutionary War by which that Independence which we now enjoy was atchieved & that in the ever memorable Action which was fought at Guilford Court House in the State of North Carolina [15 Mar 1781], he received a wound from a musket ball in one of his legs, the inconveniences resulting from which wound are very great. That he is now very old with little property & a numerous family & unable on Account of old Age & said wound to perform any kind of Labour. Your petitioner therefor presumes to ask that your Honorable Body will grant him such relief by way of pension as to you may seem fit. And your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray &c.

Cumberland County December 3<sup>d</sup> 1813

I John Woodson do hereby certify that David Tyree, who was a Soldier from the County of Powhatan at the Battle of Guilford received a wound by a Musket Ball through one of his Legs & that I have since heard him complain of the Disadvantage he Laboured under on that account John Woodson Lieutenant in the same Regiment with said Tyree
