## Bounty Land Record of John Yager VAS2075 Transcribed by Will Graves

The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the  $26^{th}$  day of February 1785, in the name of John Yager, as a Soldier of Cavalry for £12.2.10, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to himself.

I Joseph Clarke of the County of Madison and State of Virginia do depose and say that I lived for many years during and since the War of the Revolution in some 7 or 8 miles of John Yager Deceased and believed that from what I have heard during and since the Revolutionary war, that said Yager was a regular soldier in the service of the Revolution.

In testimony whereof I have signed this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February 1833
