Virginia documents pertaining to Benjamin Rigg VAS2102 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from pension records in the Library of Virginia.]

At a Court held for King George County the 4<sup>th</sup> day of September 1788 Ordered it be Certified that Betsy Rigg an Orphan of Benjamin Rigg deced who died a Soldier in the fifth Regiment of the Continental Service is at this time a resident of this County, and that she is in Indigent Circumstances. A Copy/ Lau.Berry Clk

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify that Betsy Rigg, orphan of Benjamin Rigg who was a private in the 5<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment and died in service of the United States, Is allowed the sum of Eight pounds yearly, to commence from the first day of January One thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight. Given under my hand a Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, at Richmond, this 24<sup>th</sup> day of October 1788.

NOTE: A letter apparently written in 1788 states that Betsy Rigg was then about nine or ten years old and living with her indigent grandfather. The file contains other documents similar to the above, the last being an order from Gov. James Monroe dated 18 Sep 1800 continuing Betsy Rigg on the pension roll.
