[Top part missing] and receive whatever Pension may be due to me and allowed by the General Assembly of Virginia in consideration of two wounds I received when a Soldier in Capt John Morres's [John Morris's?] Company of Militia in Kanawha County; and I hereby empower my said Attorney to pass a receipt for whatever money he may receive on my Account, hereby ratifying and Confirming whatever my said Attorney shall lawfully do in the premisses. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Ninth day of November one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine.

Monroe County to wit This day the above named John Shepherd came before us William Haynes & John Byrnside's two of the Commonwealths Justices of the Peace for the County of Monroe and acknowledged the above Instrument as his Act and Deed for the purpose therein expressed; and also made Oath that he is the person intitled to the Pension therein mentioned. Given under our hands this 19th day of November 1799.
