Westmoreland County State of Virginia To Wit

Be it known that Before me Robert Bailey A Justice of the peace in and for the county aforesaid personally appeared Job Self aged 68 years and made oath in due form of Law that he was acquainted with John Barber and knows that the said John Barber enlisted in the army of the Revolution in the early part of the war under capt Richard Barnett for and during the War that the said Barber was at the Storming of Stony point [16 Jul 1779] where he Received a wound in the Brest that the said Barber was in the Battle at Brandywine [11 Sep 1777] where he Received a Ball in the Hip which was cut out and he Recovered that the said Barber was also in the Battle at Gilford court house [sic: Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781] and also in Henry Lees troop of horse [Henry Lee's Legion] for several years and well knows that the said Barber was in actual service between six and seven years and after the close of the war was regularly discharged Given under my hand this 12 day of May 1831[?]
