Culpeper County towit October Court 1811.

John Lampkin [John Lamkin (Lampkin, Lambkin) W8018] and Peter Triplett [Peter H. Triplett W2706] came into Court and made Oath that Armistead Barnes inlisted and served as a soldier in the 1st Virginia State Regiment Commanded by Colonel Dangerfield [sic: William Daingerfield] for the term of three years. And the said John Lampkin and James Triplett made oath that William Barnes served five years in the Revolutionary war commanded by Colo. Gibson [George Gibson BLWt1985-500]. and the Court do order it to be certified that the said Armistead is the Heir at law of the said William Barnes who has departed this laife.
