## Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Abel Boggs VAS2550 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from rejected claims in the Library of Virginia.]

The deposition of William Kennahorn [W26642], aged Seventy four years or thereabouts, who being first duly sworn deposith and saith that, in the year 1776 he enlisted as a private in a company of Infantry, commanded by Captain Levin Joynes [BLWt1163-300], in the ninth Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment in the army of the Revolution, that Abel Boggs of the County of Accomack & State of Virginia enlisted in the same Company, and marched with the said Regiment to the north: that the said Abel Boggs died in the service of the State of Virginia in the said Regiment in the Revolutionary War, at or near Morris Town [Morristown] in the State of New Jersey in the year of 1778 or 1779 which this deponent does not distinctly recollect: that this deponent well knew the said Abel Boggs, and that this deponent was present in the room when he died.
