[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

Randolph West a private Soldier in the 11th Virginia Regiment in the Service of the United States of America, having served the full Term of his enlistment, is Discharged from any future service in the said Regiment.

The Deposition of James Casey [S9158] of Isle of Wight County, State of Virginia taken in Open Court this 1st day of April in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and thirty three. The Deponent being first sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God, deposeth and saith that he was well and intimately acquainted with a certain Randolph West of Isle of Wight County, and that the said Randolph West Served three Years in the Continental line, in a Company commanded by a Capt. Edmonds [Thomas Edmunds VAS997-300] in the 15th Regiment Commanded by Colonel Mason [David Mason VAS506], and all under the command of General [William] Woodford, and that the said Randolph West was a soldier in the Revolutionary War in the said Company; that he the deponent was himself a Soldier in the Revolutionary War and knows of his own knowledge, that the said Randolph West did Serve, three Years, that this deponent was in the service at the same time with the said Randolph West. That the said Randolph West departed this life in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and one, and leaving only one child to wit Margaret West who is his heir at Law. and further this deponent saith not.

The Deposition of Nath'l Pruden [Nathaniel Pruden] Sen'r of Isle of Wight County, state of Virginia take in open court this first day of April in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty three. The Deponent being first sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God declareth and saith that he was well and intimately known to and acquainted with a certain Randolph West of Isle of Wight County and that he the said Randolph West served three years in the Continental line in a company commanded by a

Captain Edmonds in the 15th Regiment commanded by Colo Mason, and all under the command of General Woodford and that the said Randolph West was a private soldier in the said company. That he the deponent was himself a soldier in the Revolutionary War and knows of his own knowledge that the said Randolph West did serve three years. that the said Randolph West departed this life in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & one leaving the following children, to Wit Margaret West who is his heir at law and further this deponent saith not

NOTE: The 15th Virginia Continental Regiment became the 11th Virginia Continental Regiment on 14 Sep 1778.
