THIS is to certify that John Burdoin a Private in the fusiliers in the First Partisan Legion, under my Command, has served faithfully & Bravely to this Day, is hereby discharged from the Service of the United States, in Pursuance of Orders received from the Commander in Chief, bearing Date the third instant.

I farther certify that John Burdoin a Private in the fusillers having been Inlisted in the State of Virginia is intituled by the Resolution of Congress, of the 13th February, 1779, to the Benefits that have been, or hereafter shall be, granted by the said State to the Noncommissioned Officers and Soldiers of the said Line.
