Kentucky Madison County Sct. [7 March 1822]

Charles Burruss states on Oath that in the year 1776 he enlisted in Bedford County Virginia for Three years in Capt William Campbell's Company of the 1st Virginia Regiment commanded by Col. Cristy [William Christian] and that he continued to serve in said [undeciphered word] until his term of Enlistment had expired at which time he was honorably discharged by the [undeciphered word] of said Regiment and that through the course of time he has lost his discharge and he has [several undeciphered words] for said service. Kentucky Jessamine County Sct [2 April 1822]

Daniel Hukill appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he was well acquainted with the above named Charles Burruss in the Revolutionary War and that he knows that the said Burruss Enlisted for Three years in the aforesaid Army and did serve out his enlistment and was honorably discharged as he has stated in his affidavit within
