
## Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Conrad Cabbage VAS2840 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

I do certify that Conrad Cabbage entered into the Regiment commanded by Colo. Rawlins [sic: Moses Rawlings VAS683] in Captain Shepherds [Abraham Shepherd W19343] company in the war of the revolution in the Virg'a Line on continental establishment for three years, and that the said Conrad Cabbage died in the service – that I acted in the said company as a recruiting sergant. Given under my hand this 27<sup>th</sup> day of June 1818. Dennis Bush [S39253]



Va. Frederick County to wit

Dennis Bush this day made oath before the undersigned Justices of the peace, that the above certificate is just and true. And that Mrs. Eliza Elzey, the wife of William Elzey is the only sister and legitimate heiress at law of the said Conrad Cabbage. Given und our hands this 27<sup>th</sup> day of June 1818 W. [last name undeciphered]

Va Frederick County to wit

John Grove declares that he was well acquainted with Conrad Cabbage, that he well recollects, when he enlisted in the war of the revolution, that Dennis Bush enlisted the said Conrad Cabbage, and that he always understood the said Conrad died in the service – and that Mrs. Eliza Elzey is the only sister and heiress at law of the said Conrad Cabbage. Sworn to before the undersigned Justices of the peace for the said County this 27<sup>th</sup> day of June 1818 W. [?]
