I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify that Elizabeth Southall, widow of Thomas Southall who was a Private in the 9th Virginia Regiment and died in Service of the United States, Is entitled to the sum of 12 pounds yearly, to commence from the 1st day of January 1786.
