At a Court held for James City County Sept'r 11th 1796[?].

A Certificate from Col J. Allison [John Allison W4112] of William Car having served three years as a Soldier in the first Virginia State Regiment, and another Certificate from Benjamin Powell a Justice of York County of the said Car's having made Oath before him of his having never before proved a claim in his Right to Land for the aforesaid Service were produced and read and ordered to be certified and recorded.

It appears from the Muster Roll of Capt John Lees Company [see endnote], first State Regiment that Wm. Carr enlisted a private soldier the first day of March 1777 for the term of three years, which term he served, and is therefore entitled to the depreciation of his pay
