Virginia documents pertaining to John Carroll VAS2905 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from rejected claims in the Library of Virginia.]

At a Quarterly Session Court continued and held for Princess Anne County the second day of August 1831.

The Court certified that satisfactory evidence was adduced to prove that John Carrol was a private in Captain Ballards Company in the Virginia line in the Continental Army during the Revolutionary war, and that he, the said Carrol served three years & upwards and to the close of the said war, and was honourably discharged. The Court further certifies that it was satisfactorily proved that William Carrol is the nephew of the said Jno. Carrol and his sole heir at law.

Princess Anne Co. to wit

Personally appeared before me Jess Morris Jr. a Justice of the Peace for the said County Malachi Carroll [S8180] a Soldier of the Revolution who did make oath that John Carroll was a Soldier of Infantry in Capt. Thos. Ballards [Thomas Ballard] Company Virginia Line and Continental Army during the War of the Revolution and was in Service 3 years & 6 months and was honourable discharge, and I certify that Malachi Carroll is worthy of credit.
