Affidavit of James Casey [S9158]

The affiant being duly sworn sayeth that he is now seventy four years of age, that he was a soldiers of the revolution, that he enlisted under Capt Henry Pitt in the Virginia Continental line fifteenth Regiment in the early part of the war. That the Regiment was commanded by Colonel David Mason, that he served [several undeciphered words] 15th Regiment and was honorably discharged and now draws a pension from the United States of eighty dollars per year that he was well acquainted with John Gibbs and [two undeciphered words] Sam'l McCoy [Samuel McCoy S38196] and Thomas Bowden [VAS34] and William Casey all of the above soldiers enlisted for three years in the fifth regiment under Captain [undeciphered] in the Virginia Continental line they all went on to the north and served three years. I went on soon after to the north myself and I saw all of them at the north in service the whole term of three years except William Casey who died in the service; that they were all from the County of Isle of Wight, Virginia, where this affiant lived before he went into the army and in which County he now lives Given under my hand & seal this 26th day of July 1833.
