Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I Holaday Revell¹ of Southampton County Virginia do hereby Certify that I was acquainted with John Speed that he enlisted in the Virginia State Service either for three years or during the war, but was Slain in Battle at the taking of Stony Point [July 16, 1779] he was shot at my left hand. Given under my hand this 7th day of April 1831
