Virginia documents pertaining to George Clark VAS3009

[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

Robert Russell sen'r [W5753] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that George Clark of this Co enlisted in the same Reg't (9th) in which the witness served, for the term of three years & that he was captured at the battle of Germantown [4 Oct 1777] & imprisoned with the witness & was in service & imprisonment nearly or quite four years. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for said County (Accomack) this 21st day of Jany 1834.

Wm. R. Custis J.P.

Levin Hyslop [W7858] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came this day before me & made oath that he was well acquainted with Geo. Clark of this county – that s'd Clark enlisted in Capt Blairs [John Blair VAS2518] Co of the 9th Va Reg't for three years was capured at Germantown & imprisoned with the witness & others & was in service nearly quite four years. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in Accomack Co this 21st Jany 1834.

Wm R. Custis J.P.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 24th day ofNovember 1785[?], in the name of George Clarke as a Soldier of Infantry for £14.2.0, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Col [John] Cropper and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

Given under my hand at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 5th day of February 1834. Jas E. Heath AUDITOR.
