Josiah Cornelius a Matross of Capt. Singleton's [Anthony Singleton BLWt2068-300] Company in the first Regiment of continental artillery commanded by Colo. Harrison [Charles Harrison VAS1411] having procured John Oliver of said Regiment to serve the Remainder of the Time for which he stands engaged, he is hereby discharged the Service of the United States. His Behaviour as a good Soldier intitles him to the Respect & Esteem of his Countrymen

Given under my hand at Camp Morris Town [Morristown NJ] this twentieth day of december 1779
