I do Certifie that Nelson Cosby marched to the South in Colo R'd. Parker's [Richard Parker BLWt525-500] detachment in 1779 & acted as a Serjeant & was taken in Charles Town [Charleston SC, 12 May 1780] & died there. Given under my hand this 17 Ap'l 1786

Intitled to depreciation from 1st december 1777 (seventy seven) to the first May 1778 as a private & from thence to May 80 as a Serjeant if not settled

Walker Austin & Rich'd Austin This day came before me a Majistrate in County aforesaid & made Oath that Edw'd Nelson Cosby was a Serjeant in the Southern Service and there died, and that a Nelson Cosby was a brother to the aforesaid Edward Nelson Cosby, but cannot tell what has become of him and that Peter Cosby, Brother to both the above is now living in the said County of Hanover & that they never knew of any other Brothers but the above.
