[The following is from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

Chesterfield County Virginia;

This day Francis Royall [S6023] and Grief Royall [W18833] two old revolutionary Soldiers and respectable Citizens of the county aforesaid personally appeared before me Robert Clarke a justice of the peace for the aforesaid County, and made Oath, that Daniel McClarren enlisted in the Virginia State Line on or about the 20th day of August in the year of 1777 in company commanded by Capt. Patrick Wright, in the 2nd Reg't of Artillery, and that he served three years as a virginia State Soldier, in the revolutionary war and in some few weeks after his return from service he had his house burnt down, and every thing he had was consumed by the fire, and they well know that he never had a land warrant.
