At a Court held for Madison County on Thursday the 25<sup>th</sup> August 1796 [several undeciphered words] made oath [undeciphered] Deboard was a soldier [several undeciphered words] the first Virginia Ridgment and that he died in the service of the United States at the White Marsh about the month of [?]mber one thousand seven hundred seventy seven according to the best Information they were able to procure which is ordered to be Certified [the rest illegible]

NOTE: The battle of Whitemarsh PA occurred on 6-7 December 1777.
