Col. Thomas Meriwether Com[missione]r Dec'r 4th 1784.

Sir. I have Requested the fav'r of Mr Chas. Porter Esq'r to bring up or send a Land warrant due on Acc't of Rob't Dedman who was kill'd a Serj't [sergeant] in Continental Service having prov'd myself Heir at Law to the s'd Rob't Dedman and you'll please to [two undeciphered words] a Warrant for the land due by the hand of the Gent. above mentioned. This shall be good for the same From yr Hble Serv't [signed] John Dedman

Test [two illegible signatures]

I do Certifie that Robert Dedman enlisted a Soldier in the first Regiment of Dragoons 27 of December 1777 for three yrs and was appointed a Sergeant the said day that he was enlisted & Continued to serve as such untill 6th day of May 1780 On which day he was killed [see endnote] [undeciphered] 31st 1784 [signature of Capt. Robert Yancey S35752 partly missing at bottom of page]

NOTE: On 6 May 1780 at Lenud's Ferry near Jamestown SC Lt. Col. William Washington's Light Dragoons were defeated by Lt. Col. Banastre Tarleton's Legion.
