Certify'd the within mention'd James Didlake enter'd Col'n Charles Harrison's [VAS1411] Reg't Cont'l Artill'y Dec'r 30th 1776 and serv'd three years as Serjeant in my Comp'y & that he rec'd a Certificate from Lt Colo. Ed. Carrington [Edward Carrington W6635] directing to apply for six months wages a [undeciphered word] from Virginia to her Soldiers & that he paid for sundry Cloathing as [undeciphered abbreviation] for which he had no return.

It is ordered to be certified to the Executive from satisfactory evidence of Conquest Royston that James Didlake deceased served as a Guner [gunner] three years in Colo. Harrison's Regiment of artillery Teste/ Thomas W. Todd D.C.C.
