State of Virginia of King & Queen County to wit The affidavit of Leonard Shackelford [S6085] taken before me Alex'r Fleet a Justice of the peace this 15th day of August 1833

This affiant being first duly sworn saith that he is nearly seventy five years old, and is a Revolutionary Pensioner that he was acquainted with William Didlick late of King & Queen County, both before & after the Revolutionary War, that the said Wm. Didlick enlisted in the same company with this affiant for the term of two years under Capt. Gregory Smith in the County of King & Queen about the year 1776 or 77 and served out his first term of enlistment for two years under Capt Thos Hill [Thomas Hill] at the North (Capt. Smith having been promoted shortly after the company was organized) and shortly before the end of the two years Wm. Didlick reenlisted at White marsh [Whitemarsh] camp in Pennsylvania for the time of three years or during the War, in the presence of this affiant, under Capt. Thomas Hill, and this affiant verily believes the said Didlick served out also his second term of enlistment as he never heard a doubt expressed to the contrary, this affiant further states that John Cropper [W3781] was Major Wm Nelson [William Nelson VAS377] Lieut Colonel – Holt Richeson [VAS1954] Colonel of the Regiment in which he served.
