The affidavit of Carter Croxton [S9250] of the county of Essex and State of Virginia aged seventy three years old

This affiant being duly sworn according to law states upon Oath that he was well acquainted with Samuel Doggons the said Doggons inlisted in the regular Service of the united states under Capt. John Webb [BLWt2052-450] or Capt. Henry Young [BLWt2466-300] in the year of 1776 or 1777 for a term of three years and further this affiant sayeth not. Sworn to and Subscribe fourter Coronton Sen this 18th day of March 1834

The affidavit of Bartlett Brizendine [R1225] of Essex County and State of Virginia aged seventy three This affiant being first duly sworn according to law state upon Oath that he was well acquainted with Samuel Doggins of Essex County that the said Doggins served two regular tours of duty in the revolutionary war, he first enlisted under Capt Webb for three years and went to the North in the year 1776 or 7.. he returned and reinlisted in the latter part of the 1780 or the first part of the year 1781 and went to the South where I was with him in the army. his last inlistment as well as I now remember was during the war and further this affiant sayeth not Sworn and Subscribed this 12th day of April 1834 Bartlett his Xmark Brizendine
