These are to Certify that Robert Doil bearer hereof was enlisted in the first Regiment of Artillery for the war and that he has received no more pay than four thousand nine hundred and fifty dollars paid in august 1781 and fifteen dollars and two thirds paid him in August 1783.

THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof Robert Doil Matross in the first Artillery regiment, having fatihfully served the United States six years and six months and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.
