I certify that James Drewry of the County of Warwick & State of Virginia did enlist in the Revolutionary War in the state Regiment, under the command of Capt. Wm Armistead [William Armistead R12155] of Colo. Nelsons [John Nelson W5414] regiment and served to the end of the war and was honorably

discharged given under my hand & seal this 18th day of May 1832 [York County] Henry Buchanan [S37807]

[The following are from rejected claims in the Library of Virginia.]

At a Court held for Warwick County at the Court House of said County on thursday the 11th day of October 1832 in the 57th year of the Commonwealth

The Court doth Certify from satisfactory evidence this day adduced that Jane the wife of John Nicholas and Sarah Havins are the only heirs at Law of James Drewry a souldier in the army of the Revelution under the Command of Captain William Armistead of Colonel Nelson's Regiment where he served till the end of the war. A Copy Teste Wm. Robertson C.C.

I certify that I have carely examined the Records of the County Court of Warwick from the year 1793 up to the present day and find no will of record of the late James Drewry, who was this day proved to the Court of said County, to have been a Soldier in the Revelutionary War. Given under my hand as Clerk of the said Court this 11th day of October 1832. Wm. Robertson
