I do hereby certify that William Drummond of Accomack county, enlisted a soldier in the 9th Virginia regiment, the latter end of the year 1775, or beginning of the year 1776, that he was promoted to the rank of Serjeant in the said regiment, that he was taken prisoner at the battle of German Town [Germantown, 4 Oct 1777], and that he served faithfully, as I have always understood, for the time he engaged.

I do hereby certify that William Drummond was enlisted in the ninth Virginia regiment on Continental establishment in the county of Accomack the latter part of the year 1776 or the begining of the year 1777, that he was promoted to be a serjeant in the said regiment, that he behaved well and that he served during the Revolutionary war. I do hereby certify that William Drummond inlisted a soldier in the 9th Virginia regiment on Continental establishment the latter end of the year 1775 or begining of the year 1776 that he was soon appointed a Serjeant that he marched with that regiment and joined the army and that he served three years the term for which he inlisted.
