I certify that no Military Land bounty warrant has issued for the services of Richard Elliott during the revolutionary war

Wm Selden Reg[iste]r/ Feb 10 1830

Dinwiddie County To wit

This day Thomas Wilkinson [S41347] personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the said county and made Oath to the following facts relative to Col Richard Elliott who was a state line officer in the regular army and served Three years or upwards and was at the close of the war say the said wilkinson was with him at the siege of York [Yorktown 28 Sep - 19 Oct 1781] Sworn to before me this 18th September

I Henry Elliott of the Town of Petersburg do hereby certify that I am well acquainted with Mr. George Elliott, and know that he is one of the Legal Heirs of Colo. Richard Elliott Dec'd. Given under my hand this 20th September 1830 [signed] Henry Elliott

I do not find the name of Richard Elliott on the list of officers of the State line, who received certificates for the balance of their full pay.

I Thomas Wilkinson Sr of the county of Dinwiddie having been duly sworn do state that Col Richard Elliott was in the revolutionary war & there served Three years & upwards in the state service & did serve to the close of the war & which a former statement made & sworn to will more fully appear. Given under my hand this 5th Oct'r 1830

I Thomas Wilkinson Sr. of the County of Dinwiddie having been duly sworn do state that Col. Richard Elliott was a Colonel in the Virginia State line of the revolutionary army and did service as such to the close of the War. Given under my hand this 8th day of October 1830
