THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof John Evans a Soldier in the first Virginia regiment, having fatihfully served the United States from the 15<sup>th</sup> Sep'r 1777 to this date and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 6<sup>th</sup> day of July 1783
