

I Do hereby certify that Thos Goldsby was a private soldier in my comp'y of foot [company raised in Rockbridge County] in the 12th Virg'a Reg't on Continental Establishment and died of the small Pox whilst in the servie on the 3^d Day of February 1778 & is (in my oppinion) or his heirs Entitled to the Bounty in Land allowed them Given under my hand this 22^d Day of July 1779

N.B. the above Soldier always went by the Name singly of Thos. Goldsby and stands in all the returns But since his death and my return from the service have been Credibly informed and believe he had a double Name (Edward Thos Goldsby Wm. McKee &c
