I do Certify that Clement Green Inlisted as a private, in the Legionary Corps Commanded by Col Armand [Charles Armand BLWt2291-850] on the 19th day of October 1781 for three years, and that he was Regularly discharged at york Town Pensylvania, at the time the said Corps disbanded, that he was at the time he enlisted and now is a Citizen of Virginia. Given under my hand this 14th day of April 1798
