Wiley Griggs and Anderson Griggs parties to the within memorial personally appeared before me James Temple[?] a justice of the peace for the County aforesaid and made oath to the truth of the same. given under my hand and seal the 23rd day of may 1835 James Temple[?] J.P.

The affidavit of Bartlett Brizendyne [Bartlett Brizendine R1225] a pensioner for services rendered the united states as a private in the army of the revolutionary war, aged seventy years [undeciphered] this 11 day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty [illegible] that he was well acquainted with Philip Grigg a private in the army of the revolution. That he recollects [illegible] he was also marched to the north [several undeciphered words] to what regiment he belonged, they belonged to different regiments, this deponent also says [several undeciphered words] Bartlett hisXmark Brizandyne
