I do hereby certify that John Grinter Serg't in Colo Gist's [Nathaniel Gist BLWt1874-500] detachment of Virginia line has served the full time [undeciphered] for which he was inlisted & is hereby discharged from the Service, that he has rec'd his pay in Continental currency up to the [illegible] day of November one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine since which he has rec'd only two dollars in Specie from the D. Commissary [undeciphered] of Provisions in Charles Town. Given under my hand at Williamsburg this the twenty fifth day of July one thousand seven hundred & eighty one

I do certify that John Grinter enlisted himself with me August the first 1777 for to serve in the 12<sup>th</sup> Virg'a Reg't and was advanced to Sergeant the first of Dec'r 1779
