These are to certify that John Hamilton Formerly a soldier of the 7th Virginia Regiment has duly and faithfully served the time of three years for which he was enlisted in consequence of which and at his own request he is hereby discharged from any farther service in the army of the United States and permitted to return to his home free and unmolested he having received all his bounty pay – Clothing and Deficiency of pay and Clothing in full of all allowance and provision made by Congress for their troops, his receipt for which is on the back hereof.

Given under my hand at Philadelphia this 2^d day of February 1780.
