This is to Certify that Carter Hamlett a [several undeciphered words] untill the First Day of March Then he Join the head Quarters at Rich'd [undeciphered] Brunswick

Robt. Lyell Capt [Robert Lyell] 18 Feb'y 1777

Carter Hamlet A Private Soldier in the third Regiment having Served his full Time of Inlistment is therefore Discharg'd from the said Service & Recommended to the notice of Evry Good Person as one that has Ever behaved himself as a good & [illegible] Soldier Given under my hand at Haddrals Point [see endnote] this 20th Day of Feb'y [illegible year]

Wm Henderson [William Henderson R14952] [undeciphered] 9th Regoment

In Lunenburg County Court 9th February 1815

Ordered that it be certified that it appears to the satisfaction of this court, that Carter Hamlett was a soldier in the revolutionary war & that he served the full period of his inlistment which was three years and further that he was honorable discharged.

"Haddrals Point" may refer to Haddrell's Point near Charleston SC.

In <u>rejected claims in the Library of Virginia</u> there is a letter by Edmund F. Taylor of Lunenburg County stating that in the fall of 1816 Carter Hamlett gave him his discharge and other papers, which Taylor subsequently lost.
