Feb'y 26th 1799

I certify that James Silcock was a Soldier in the Infantry of [several illegible words] Colonel [Henry] Lee in the course of the war with Great Britain and that he continued in service untill the close of the war, or died a short time previous to its expiration [several illegible words]

[illegible signature of P. Johnson (Peter Johnston W27629 = Peter Johnstone VAS1263) late a Lieutenant in the Legion commanded by Lt. Colo. Lee

No Warrant appears to have issued to James Silcock for military bounty

14 Dec'r 1808

this the 11th November 1801

this day Came John geffers [John Jeffers?] before me a gestis of the Peas for Pitsylvania [sic: Pittsylvania] County and Mad oath that James Silcock Listed in the infantry and Served as a Solgar for three years and that the said James Silcock dyed in the armey Sertyfyed Before me
