Virginia documents pertaining to Francis Hume VAS3868 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia in the 1811 file of Johnson, John. Although the claimed service was for the French and Indian War, I have chosen to transcribe it because it apparently refers to bounty-land applicants who did serve in the Revolutionary War.]

Culpeper County to Wit

This day Diana Stanton personally appeared before me Stanton Slaughter one of the commonwealths justices of the peace for the county aforesaid and made oath that Francis Hume Senior of said county went out under Capt John Field against the Indians & remained several months Given under my hand this thirty first day of July 1811 Stanton Slaughter

Virginia

At a Court held for M[?] County the 21st[?] day of [undeciphered] 1811

Ordered that it be Certified to the [undeciphered word] of this state that it was proven to the satisfaction of this Court that Francis Hume of Culpeper County served as a Militiaman under Capt John Field from the County of Culpeper in the Indian and French war. [undeciphered sentence]
