These are to Certify that John Humpheys [sic] Formerly a Soldier in the 8th Virginia Regiment has duly and faithfully served the Term of Three years for which he was Inlisted, in Consequence of which and at his own Request he is hereby Discharged from any further service in the army of the United States & is permitted to return to his home free and unmolested he having received all his bounty pay [illegible] Deficiencies of Cloathing in full of all allowances [several illegible words] for their Troops his receipt for which is on the Back hereof

Given under my hand at Philidelphia this [illegible] 1780
