[THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof] William Jackson a Soldier [in the] first Virginia regiment, [having] faithfully [served] the United States from 18<sup>th</sup> of March[?] 1781 to [this] date and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 6 July [1783]

By order of the secretary at war,

B. Lincoln [Gen. Benjamin Lincoln]
