Feb. 3rd 1831

Dr Mr Robert Gran[?]

Sir I understand that you are going to Richmond for the purpose of making an examination into the revolutionary claims I desire that you you will see whether there ever was a warrant issued in my Fathers name for his Military Service during the revolutionary war as a soldier in the Virginia Line. if not cause the same to Issued and bring it to his heirs. he enlisted in the Co. Commanded by Capt. Elias Edmonds [VAS2004] and was in the Reg't com by Col Morgan, and I also [several undeciphered words] that he never got his monthly pay for about three years of the time he enlisted for during the war. Draw his money [undeciphered] for the same and you will confer a particular favor on me. I am Respectfully – James Keeble/ for himself & heirs/ of James Keeble De'd.

State of Virginia

Fauq'r [Fauquier] County to wit

This day William Tomlin [S6261] personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace for said county and made oath that he was well acquainted with James Keeble [illegible] a soldier of the Virg Continental line in the revolution he enlisted for three years in Capt. Edmonds Company and faithfully served out his time Given under my hand this 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1831
