[From rejected claims in the Library of Virginia.]

Friday the 19th of March 1779.

Ordered that Mr Anderson deliver Mr. Lacy half ton of Iron, and one hundred weight of Steel for the Chickahominy Ship Yard.

The above is truly copied from Journal of the Navy Board. (page 4.)

Given under my hand at the Auditors Office Richmond this 13th day of January 1848.

To the honorable William Smith/Governor of Virginia

On behalf of the Heirs of the late Richard Lacy, a Midshipman of the State Navy of Virginia, I respectfully represent to your Honor – That said Richard Lacy on the 25th day of April, in the year 1785, received a certificate for the balance of his full pay as a Midshipman of the Virginia State Line. Your Honor is refered to a report made 25th November 1834 by John H. Smit, Commissioner appointed by the State of Virginia, being document No. 43, by which the said Midshipman Richard Lacy is reported to be entitled to land bounty for his service in the revolutionary war.

I herewith lay before you a certificate of the Auditor on the same subject. These facts shew that the Heirs of said Richard Lacy are entitled to Bounty Land. Midshipmen were entitled to bounty six hundred acres. A warrant for the land might not be worth much to the Heirs, but I should like to see them get all to which their revolutionary ancestor was entitled. Respectfully/ R. T. Lacy Feb'y 11^{th} 1848
